

## **APK 2020**

The Asia-Pacific Conference of German Business (APK) is the flagship event for business leaders, executives, and political representatives to discuss and promote economic relations between Germany and Asia-Pacific. Since 1986, the conference is being held biennially in various locations across the Asia-Pacific region. The APK is jointly organized by the Asia-Pacific Committee of German Business (APA), the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy (BMWi), and the German Chambers of Commerce Abroad (AHK) in Asia-Pacific. It is co-chaired by the APA-Chairman, President and CEO of Siemens AG Joe Kaeser and the German Federal Minister for Economic Affairs and Energy Peter Altmaier. The local host is the German Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Japan (AHK Japan).
